

Do you have **persistent pain** at or below the level of injury and live in **Sydney metropolitan area**?

Researchers at NeuroRecovery Research Hub, the University of New South Wales (UNSW) are recruiting participants for a pilot trial to examine the effect of an EEG neurofeedback system as an innovative treatment for chronic neuropathic pain after a spinal cord injury.

This intervention includes 20 sessions of 3x5-minutes of EEG neurofeedback over a period of 4 weeks. During the intervention, you will be wearing an EEG headset to record your brain waves, while you are playing an interactive game. The aim of the trial is to see if participants can reduce their pain by learning how to control their brain waves.

The treatment can be done at home where a researcher will visit you daily, or at our NeuroRecovery Research Hub, UNSW, Randwick.



You will be reimbursed for your time in the trial, plus any travel expenses.
